Ready-to-use rodenticide grain bait (product type 14) for the control of house mice and brown rats indoors and outdoors around buildings.

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FEATURES: ROMAX B RAT & MOUSE KILLER is a ready-to-use grain bait for the control of house mice and brown rats at all development stages containing Bromadiolone, a second-generation anticoagulant active ingredient. Thanks to its mode of action, rodents' death occurs without rousing suspicion towards the half by the other members of the rollow

ROMÁX B RAT & MOUSE KULLER is a rodenticide bait consisting of decorticated wheat, manufactured with SAT (Special Absorption Technology) technology, allowing the homogeneous distribution of the active ingredient both inside and on the surface of the grain. This bait is ideal for treatments when rodents' diet is mainly based on corn seeds consumption, such as in rural and zoo-technical buildings, and particular civil and industrial areas (feed production, flour processing, mills, etc.). The product contains a well-balanced mix of food-origin components attractive for the rodents' species previously mentioned and incorporates a bittering agent (Denatonium Benzoate) to help prevent human consumption.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE: Category of users: professional users with demonstrated competence, equivalent to trained professionals.

Application method: ready-to-use bait to be used in tamper-resistant bait stations or in covered and protected baiting points.

Application rates and frequency:

For the control of house mice (Mus musculus) - indoor and outdoor around buildings uses:

High infestation: up to 50 g of bait per baiting point every 2 metres;

Low infestation: up to 50 g of bait per baiting point every 5 metres;

For the control of brown rats (Rattus norvegicus) - indoor and outdoor around buildings uses:

High infestation; up to 100 g of bait per baiting point every 5 metres;

Remove the remaining product at the end of treatment period.

Sites under a permanent baiting regime should be inspected regularly in accordance with product label directions. The period between visits should be determined by the technician in charge but will not be longer that every four weeks when permanent baiting is conducted outdoors. For permanent baiting follow any additional instructions provided by the CRRU Guidance on Permanent Baiting.

For outdoor around buildings use: protect bait from atmospheric conditions. Place the baiting points in areas not liable to flooding. Replace any bait in baiting points in which bait has been damaged by water or contaminated by dirt. For outdoor use, baiting points must be covered and placed in strategic sites to minimise the exosure to non-tareet soecie.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE: Read and follow the product information as well as any information accompanying the product or provided at the point of sale before using it. Carry out a pre-bating survey of the infested area and an on-site assessment in order to identify the rodent species, the places of activity and determine the likely cause and the extent of the infestation. Remove food which is readily attainable for rodents (e.g. spilled grain or food waste). Apart from this, do not clean up the infested area just before the treatment, as this only disturbs the rodent population and makes ball acceptance more difficult to achieve.

The product should only be used as part of an integrated pest management (IPM) system, including, amongst others, hygiene measures and, where possible, physical methods of control. The product should be placed in the immediate vicinity of places where rodent activity has previously occurred (e.g. rodent runs, nesting sites, holes, burrows etc.). Where possible, bait stations must be fixed to the ground or other structures. Bait stations must be clearly labelled to show they contain rodenticides and that they must not be moved or onened. Bait should be secured so that it cannot be drazeed away from the bait station.

Place the product out of the reach of children, birds, pets and farm animals and other non-larget animals. Place the product away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs, as well as from utensilor or surfaces that have contact with these. We pare protective chemical resistant glowing product handling phase (EN 374, category III). When using the product do not eat, drink or smoke. Wash hands and directly exposed skin after using the product. The frequency of visits to the treated area should be at the discretion of the operator, in the light of the survey conducted at the outset of the treatment. If bait uptake is low relative to the apparent size of the infestation, consider the replacement of bait points to further places and the possibility to change to another bait formulation. If after a treatment period of 35 days balts continued to be consumed and no decline in rodent activity is observed, the likely cause must be determined. Where other elements have been excluded, it is likely that there are resistant rodents as an alternative control measure.

Place losse bait in the bait point by using a dosage device. After placing the bait, clean avoiding the dust formation, for instance, with the help of a wet wipe. Conditions of storage and shelf-life: store in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place. Keep the container closed and away from direct sunlight. Store in places prevented from the access of children, birds, pets and farm animals. Shelf-life: 2 years from its manufacturing date.

Other information: because of their delayed mode of action, anticoagulant rodenticides take from 4 to 10 days to be effective after consumption of the bait. Rodents can be disease carriers. Do not touch dead rodents with bare hands, use gloves or use tools such as tongs when disposing them. This product contains a bittering agent and a dye. Do not tear the inner bag from the package.

RISK MITIGATION MEASURES. Where possible, prior to the treatment inform any bystanders (e.g. users of the treated area and their surroundings) about the rodent control campaign. Consider preventive control measures (e.g. plug holes, emove potential food and drinking as far as possible) to improve product intake and recture the likelihood of reinvasion. To reduce risk of secondary poisoning, search for and remove dead rodents during treatment at frequent intervals, in line with the recommendations provided by the CRMU RIC dead of Sest Practice. Permanent basing is strictly willed to sites with a high potential for reinvasion when other methods of the residence of the reinvasion when other methods of the risk for reinfectation. Do not use this product in pushed bating treatments. Do not use in area where resistance to the active substance is suspected. If ingested, symptoms, which may be delayed, may include nosebled and beleding gums. In severe cases, there may be bruising and blood present in the faeces or urine. Antidote: Vitamin KI administered by medical/veterinary personnel only.

In case of:

- Dermal exposure, wash skin with water and then with water and soap.

Eve exposure, rinse eves with eves-rinse liquid or water, keep eves lids open at least 10 minutes.

- Oral exposure, rinse mouth carefully with water. Never give anything by mouth to unconscious person. For indoor use: when placing bait points close to water drainage systems, ensure that bait contact with water is avoided.

For outdoor around buildings use: when placing bait points close to surface waters (e.g. rivers, ponds, water channels, dykes, irrigation ditches) or water drainage systems, ensure that bait contact with water is avoided.

Instructions for safe disposal of the product and its packaging: at the end of the treatment, dispose of uneaten bait and the packaging in accordance with local requirements.
